### **NOTICES**

SNOW REMOVAL: There has been some frustration regarding snow and ice accumulation on the streets after our recent snowstorms and melting. It has been a hardship for many. If you are doing your own snow removal, please be mindful of your neighbors. Do not block them in, do not pile your snow and ice on their property, etc. Thank you! The only snow removal the town is required to provide is the school bus route. First and Third Streets, Ohio Avenue, and Kansas. We clear the bus route, and we also try to help by clearing the snow berms that WYDOT leaves at the entrance of each one of our streets when they plow the highway.

**TOWN WATER**- Please remember to keep a pencil-lead size stream of water trickling to prevent water lines from freezing even with the warmer weather, frost line is deep. We are continuing the winter water allowance due to the extreme weather.

DID YOU KNOW...Property owners are responsible to make sure their water meter can be read and is accessible. Please remove snow, weeds, animal waste, etc. Per Ordinance, the OWNER of the property is responsible for any damage to the meter and may be charged an ADDITIONAL \$40 FEE if your meter is unreadable or inaccessible. Due to the unusually high amount of snow, the water meters have been estimated over the past several months. We will begin reading meters again as soon as possible.

<u>NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS</u>: Please be considerate of your neighbors. Please clean up after your dogs Please make sure you know where your dog is at all times. Dogs running at large are not allowed and will be reported to the Sheriff's office.

<u>Permits:</u> There are Town Ordinances regarding mobile homes, buildings, fences, etc., so please make sure to read and check on setback permits, mobile home/trailer permits, or home improvements, etc.

Auto Pay for your water/sewer bill: Did you know you can now pay your utility bill by text? Auto pay is also available. Your bill will be paid timely, on a specific day of the month. No more writing a check or stopping by Town Hall to pay before the 20th. If you don't want to use auto pay, you can still sign up to use xpressbillpay and pay online at your convenience. It's free to sign up and free to use!
