WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper that we, the citizens of Hudson, pause to reflect on the immense sacrifices made by the brave men and women who have defended our freedoms and way of life; and

WHEREAS, these heroes, through their courage, dedication, and unwavering commitment, have preserved the liberties and values that are the cornerstone of our nation; and

WHEREAS, Memorial Day serves as a solemn reminder of the cost of freedom and the importance of remembering those who have given their lives to secure it;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the Mayor of the Town of Hudson, Wyoming, that:


1. Monday, May 25, 2026, shall be observed as Memorial Day in the Town of Hudson.

3. Let us never forget the debt we owe to those who have sacrificed their lives for our nation and let us strive to uphold the ideals for which they fought.



This year, as we celebrate America's 250th birthday, it is important that we take time to honor those who made the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom.


Each Memorial Day, we pay our respects to those who gave their lives to defend America's values. We reflect on the debt we owe these heroes and the families they left behind.
